




SADO NIIGATA TOURISM ZONE



Sado Island consists of two mountain ranges with plain areas in between. Part of its beautiful coastline belongs to a quasi-national park. The island was a designated penal colony for political dissidents during the Imperial Court of the Nara Period in the 8th century. The discovery of gold made the island under direct control of the Tokugawa Shogunate in the 17th century, and the following marine transport businesses brought positive socioeconomic impacts from other regions of the country. The combinations of the aristocratic, samurai and commercial exchanges have fused together to form a unique culture. Food varieties of land and sea are also a great attraction.

# What is Niigata City?

The prefectural seat of government, Niigata City is located at the estuary of Japan's longest river, the Shinano. During the Edo period Niigata prospered as a port city on the *Kitamae-bune* shipping route, and during the last days of the Tokugawa Shogunate Niigata became one of the first 5 ports in Japan to be opened to outside trade. The Niigata Furumachi Geigi (geisha girls) and the former Niigata Customs House are living symbols of the port culture that still thrives in the city today. Niigata is not only home to fertile soil, relaxing hot springs, and beautiful sunsets over the Sea of Japan coast. As one of Japan's most prominent rice and sake regions, Niigata City is also the perfect place to enjoy refined cuisine and fresh seafood from the Sea of Japan.

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# 🗲 Food

Sado, with its high mountains, fertile plains and well-stocked seas round about, is a treasury of various tastes. Fresh seafood and fruit, and the very best quality Koshihikari rice, are some of the things visitors must try while they are here.



## Benizuwaigani (red snow crab)

Red snow crab, or *benizu-waigani*, caught in the sea near Sado, is exceptionally fresh. It should be eaten as soon as it is boiled so that its firm flesh can be appreciated.



### Namban-Ebi Also known as sweet

shrimp, or *amaebi*, are delicious when eaten raw as sashimi.



# Kamburi (yellowtail)

*Buri*, or yellowtail, is Sado's finest fish. Buri caught in winter, called Kamburi, when the flesh is fatty is highly prized as a high quality delicacy typical of Sado.



# Kaki (oysters)

As it is surrounded by the sea, Sado offers a rich variety of shellfish including oysters, *sazae* or horned turban, and *awabi*, or abalone. Oyster farming is also widely practiced.



## Ika (squid)

Huge amount of squid are caught on Sado, and out at sea in summer visitors can see the fishing lights for luring the squid to the boats. *Ika somen*, or long, thin strands of noodle-like squid with a wonderful consistency, is another delicacy of Sado.



## Burikatsu-don

This specialty comes with a bowl of Sado's *Koshihikari* rice topped with fried yellowtail fish caught in Sado's water. Fried pieces are flavored with an original sauce made from soy-based *ago dashi* broth.



## Okesa Gaki (a type of persimmon)

A wide variety of fruit is grown on Sado. Of these, the *okesa gaki*, a large, flat type of persimmon without any pit, is particularly well known. Once the astringent taste has been removed, the thick, creamy flesh of the fruit is considered to be of the finest quality among persimmons.





# Koshihikari & Toki to Kurasu Sato Rice

Koshihikari, cultivated in a lush natural environment, enjoys a reputation as one of Japan's finest varieties of rice. *Toki to Kurasu Sato* (lit, the home of the Japanese crested ibis) Rice is grown with great concern for food safety with less than half the conventional amount of pesticides and herbicides.

# **5** Events



Hina-matsuri Doll Festival Dates: During March Locations: Aikawa and Ryotsu Areas

Japan has a tradition of displaying *hina dolls* during this season to celebrate the sound growth of girls in early ages. Visitors can see those classical exhibitions in these areas.



An international music and arts festival held in August. The highlight of the festival is a performance by Kodo, taiko drummers who give concerts across the world. The festival lasts three days and includes various events, culminating in an open air concert.



Many enjoyable activities are held on Sado, from small, traditional festivals to sports competitions and events with a strong international flavor.

Ondeko in Niibo & Toki Yubae Flea Markets Dates: Early October Location: Sado City Niibo Office

This is an active local event in which the main themes are outdoor stalls, *onidaiko*, or deity-masked dance, and *toki*, or Japanese crested ibis. The event holds the island's largest gathering of outdoor stalls, with over 90 shops. A number of *onidaiko* groups demonstrate their dance performance with robust drum beats.



Do-oshi Sacred Ceremony Dates: January 3rd Location: Bishamon-do Temple in Tsukibuse, Ryotsu area

Do-oshi ceremony is intended to ward off evil spirits of men in yakudoshi, a set of believed "unlucky" ages. After a Buddhist priest has chanted a sutra, bean husks are burned on the hearth and the holy ministers bang on the wooden wall inside the hall, while those men are lifted up by holy carriers in loin and pushed round the hall. The event is held in the evening of January 3rd every year.

# Performing Arts

On Sado, where a variety of cultures met and mingled, different types of traditional performing arts have been preserved.





# Sado Okesa

Folk song and dance style typical of Japan, with plaintive tunes and graceful dancing, visitors can see *okesa* all over Sado.



### Bun-ya Ningyo This puppet theater is the original

form of classic *joruri*. The simple, minimal performances are played with the plaintive melody and songs accompanied by the *shamisen*.

# Onidaiko

This is a rare type of traditional performing art found only on Sado. Each area of the island has its own style handed down from generation to generation. The performances, where deity-masked performers dance wildly to the stirring beat of the drum, is a Shinto ritual driving out evil spirits and praying for a good harvest.

# Takigi Noh

Sado Island is a place where Zeami, the founder of Noh, was exiled in the 15th century. Local preservation groups occasionally present their performance. Over 30 active outdoor Noh stages are found on the island. Takigi Noh in particular, performed beside a bonfire, takes you back to ancient times.

# Sulture and Activities



Many influences and technologies from other regions of the country and beyond have been introduced to Sado Island since ancient times and, as a result, the island has developed a unique culture.





Shukunegi

The Shukunegi area in the Ogi Peninsula functioned as a base of the marine transportation shipbuilding business form the 18th century to the early 20th century and generated a great amount of wealth. Nar-

row passages and alleys along with closely-packed houses are well preserved just as they were long ago. Many houses are built with leftover materials of shipbuilding, and one of those houses looks just like a ship. The national government has designated the area as an important historic site, and a local preservation group has been maintaining this valuable townscape.

## Sado Gold Mine (Sado Kinzan)

#### Doyu-no-Wareto Outcrop

Sado Gold Mine, the symbol of Sado, was discovered in 1601 and developed to become an important base of support for the Tokugawa Shogunate, achieving maximum prosperity during the early Edo Period in

the 17th century. The split in the mountain, known as *doyu-no-wareto* outcrop, was a result of open-cut mining from the summit. Although its mining business was discontinued in 1989, visitors can enter and observe the remaining mining tunnels as historic landmarks and scientific exhibitions of the days of the gold mine. Sado Gold Mine has been on the nation's tentative list of World Heritage candidate sites to be nominated to UNESCO.



# Seisuiji Temple and Guzeden Platform Myosenji Temple and Five-story Pagoda Tower

Over 280 old shrines and temples can be found on Sado. Seisuiji Temple was modeled after Kyoto's Kiyomizudera Temple, while Myosenji Temple features a five-story pagoda tower, a nationally designated important cultural asset.

# Hands-on Experiences

# Taraibune Tub Boat

An unusual type of tub boat was invented by local fishers out looking for *sazae*, or horned turban, and *wakame* seaweed in the Ogi area. Tourists can try out a handson experience on these tubs. Though it might look a little



scary, there's no need to worry because an instructor in traditional island dress will provide instructions in the boat.

## Pottery

Visitors can try their hand at making *mumyoi* pottery, a type of pottery unique to Sado, which uses clay containing iron dioxide found adjacent to Sado Gold Mine.





# NATURE

Clear water, panoramic views and unspoiled natural beauty are all here for visitors to enjoy.

#### Ono-game

There are magnificent views from the summit, 167 meters above sea level, of this enormous, monolithic rock jutting out of the sea. The area is carpeted with tobishima kanzo, or yellow day-lilies in early June, found in the wild only here and in Tobishima in Akita Prefecture.




Natural Cedar Trees Observe Sado's natural cedar trees

Gold Panning Sado's Nishimikawa Gold Park is a popular attraction set up near the locations in which placer mining collected gold in the

past. Visitors can experience the thrill of discovering gold deposits and take home the precious metal obtained. The exhibition hall displays scientific materials, and souvenir items are available in the shop.





## Genkakuwan Bay

This area belongs to part of the Sado-Yahiko-Yoneyama Quasi-National Park, one of the first registered quasi-national parks in 1950. The name of Senkaku is a direct translation of Hardanger Fjord in Norway because of the similarity in scenic beauty. Visitors can enjoy a glass-bottomed boat cruise through the marine park zone.



Playing the Drums at Sado Island Taiko Centre Many visitors have great fun at Sado Island Taiko Centre, Instructors are staff members of internationally renowned taiko drum group Kodo. Participants can also have a try on a

pair of large drums made from a 600vear old zelkova tree.

You may choose between three locations where you can experience riding a tub boat: Rikiya Kanko Kisen, Yajima-Kyoshima, and Shukunegi Hangiri.



#### B Shukunegi see p10 40min by car

Having been a port since the medieval times, Shukunegi went through the prosperous 17th century brought about by Sado Kinzan Gold Mine, and developed as a kitamaebune port of call for the merchant shipping industry. Facing a small inlet, Shukunegi is characterised by the



crowded rows of over 100 houses built with plate walls made from ship planks, and it has been designated as a National Important Preservation Area for Traditional Buildings and Architecture. Three private houses are open to the public (admission charges required), and the entire Shukunegi village represents a history of involvement in ship-related industries.

#### Hokusetsu Sake Brewery 60min by car

Hokusetsu Shuzo Sake Brewery was established in 1872. Hokusetsu is a dry, smooth sake, which evokes images of heavy snow in the northern provinces. Sake produced by Hokusetsu is loved at Nobu restau-



rants in New York, Los Angeles, London, Milan, and Dubai, among others, which attract celebrities from around the world.

Aikawa flourished thanks to the gold and silver mine. There are accommodations along the coast line from which one has a magnificent view over the Sea of Japan and the sunset. How about enjoying the view while soaking in an open air Onsen?







# Kitazawa Flotation I5min by car

The Kitazawa area in Aikawa is home of a group of facilities such as a power plant and a thickener (designated National Historical Site), which contributed to modernization of mines. The flotation method had



originally been used for copper beneficiation, but at Kitazawa Flotation Plant, the technniques were applied to silver and gold extraction, and successfully utilized for the first time in the world. Under a war-time plan of increase in production, largescale investment was made. As a result, the Flotation Plant was able to process over 50,000 tonnes of ore per month, and the plant was declared the greatest one in the East.



Kyomachi Street is a main street that connects Aikawa's gold and silver mines with the Sado Commissioner's Office. Kyomachi Street leads up the hill from Shimokyomachi, where the time bell tower is located, through Nakakyomachi to Kamikyomachi. In the past, many residences of both mine-related workers and merchants used to stand side-by-side on this street. The street itself, studded with narrow alleyways, is a reminder of the haphazard town planning that took place during Aikawa's time of prosperity. A symbolic event of Kyomachi Street, "Yoi-no-mai", is held in early June. Dancers, clad in kimonos of the past, dance to the Aikawa Ondo folk song and accompanying music



# **Fransportation** (From Niigata to Sado)

#### Car Ferry —

The car ferry takes 2 hours and 30 minutes between Niigata and Ryotsu. Apart from the large, carpeted 2nd class lounge, reservations are required for all upper class seats. There is also a suite complete with a reception room. Reservations can be made at all Sado Kisen information desks and travel agencies. Early reservations for vehicles are recommended.

# Transportation (on Sado)



Roads on Sado are slightly narrower than those on the mainland and there are a large number of tunnels. There is no railway. Cars are the principal means of transportation, but the bus network covering the whole island is also widely used both by locals and tourists. Regular tourist buses, taxis and car rentals are also an important means of transport.

Bus

There are 16 fixed bus routes on the island which can take visitors to places where tourist buses do not go. During the tourist season there are additional bus services. for convenience, to Sado Gold Mine and Sobama Beach. The fun of bus journeys on the island is that, with the exception of certain parts of main routes, visitors can hop on and off as often as they wish. Some routes offer less freauent services. English bus timetables are available at the tourist information offices.

Fares for fixed route buses are calculated based on the distance traveled each trip (up to ¥820), and payment is made when passengers get off. Bus passes are also available. See right.

Regular Sightseeing Buses

Guided sightseeing bus tours comfortably take participants to select spots. These tours are all Japanese. The tours may be canceled due to irregular conditions. No partial refunds for leaving the tour early.



Generally speaking, cars are the principal means of transport. Since Sado is bigger than many people would think, there is often guite a distance between point of arrival and destination. If driving on Sado, it is wise to prepare for ample fuel and time.







# Niigata City Transportation

As well as on foot, you can get around Niigata City by route bus, Loop bus, rent-a-cycle and taxi. Express busses also run from Niigata Station to various places in the prefecture.





## Niigata Kotsu Bus

Around Niigata City the "Niigata Kotsu Bus" runs route and express busses. Many route and express busses run from the 3 bus terminals at Niigata Station Bandai Exit (in front of Niigata station), Niigata Station South Exit, Bandai City Bus Center.

## How to Ride

Get on at either the center or rear door, get off through the front door, and pay the fare when you leave. You can pay with cash by taking a numbered ticket when you get on, or you can use an IC card such as "SUICA" or "RYUTO".



# Rent-a- Cycle

Around Niigata's inner city you can cheaply use a recycled bicycle with "Niigata Rent-a-Cycle," and there is "Smart Cruise" where for ¥1,000 24 hours you can use a world top brand sports bicycle.




